In 2025, the Arts and Enrichment After School Program (A&E) became a source of inspiration and growth for **more than 90 children and their families**. By providing a safe, nurturing space for children in grades K-5 across the Fox Chapel Area School District, we empower young minds to learn, play, and explore their potential after the school day ends. The program's remarkable growth - doubling in size in the past decade - and its continued certification by the Pennsylvania Office of Child Development and Early Learning demonstrate our unwavering commitment to excellence and every child's bright future.

Last year, our neighbors embraced **more than 150 wellness, growth, and discovery programs** at the center - each one a testament to our vibrant community spirit. From energizing sports to creative arts and strategic games, our offerings engage individuals from ages 3 to 103. These classes do more than build knowledge and skills; they foster friendships, strengthen bonds, and create a sense of belonging that makes our community truly special.

Summer at our community center is especially alive with the laughter and enthusiasm of **65 campers** aged 3-12 each week, filling our spaces with energy and joy. Each themed week sparks creativity and encourages collaboration, ensuring that every child leaves with new memories, friendships, and a deeper connection to our community.

Perhaps most inspiring of all, we were able to **provide \$55,000 in scholarships** to individuals and families, opening doors and making it possible for anyone in our community to participate and thrive. This achievement reflects our deep belief that opportunity and belonging should be accessible to all.

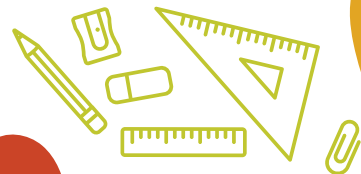

Every weekday afternoon during the school year from 3:45 to 6:00pm, up to **75 students** fill our building with excitement and laughter. Children from all four Fox Chapel Area School District elementary schools arrive by bus, eager to start their after-school adventures with us.

PROGRAMMING

From toddlers to seniors, our community embraced a world of learning, creativity, and connection in 2025. Whether it was a single day of wreath-making or a year of graceful ballet, our neighbors had plenty of opportunities to discover something new. Over 150 discovery programs opened doors for more than 1800 friends to create artwork, compete in sports, master skills from CPR to Mahjongg, and unwind with meditation and Reiki. These vibrant programs brought people together, forging friendships around shared passions.

SUMMER CAMP



In 2025, over 220 different children connected, learned, and played in our summer camps. For children ages 3-5, we reintroduced our half-day camp, which gives our youngest campers their first experiences working together and learning about the world, all while using their imaginations. Camp themes included modes of transportation, what's in our oceans, outer space exploration, and Bigfoot.



For students aged 5-12, our full-day camp took a more focused approach. Campers were encouraged to integrate STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) as they built watercraft, designed a miniature golf course, and created their own city with storefronts and consumer goods for sale. Campers in this age group have access to specialized tools, including 3D printers, laser cutters, and chomp saws.

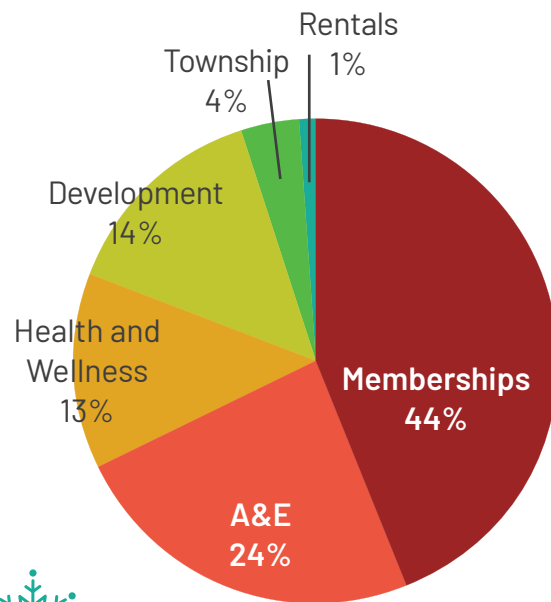

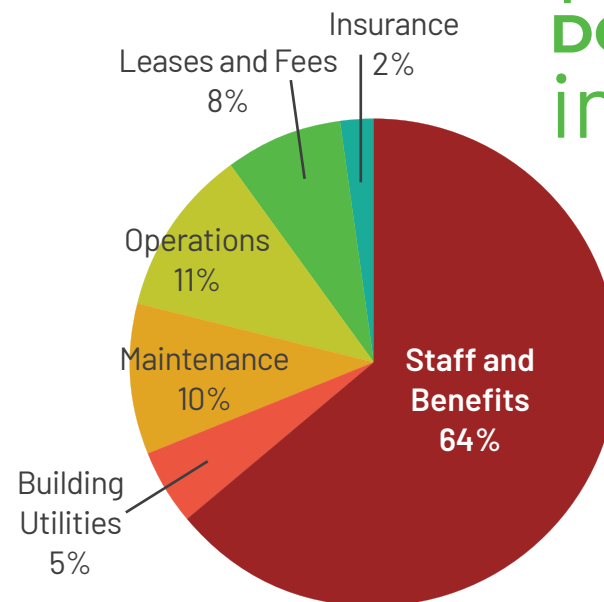

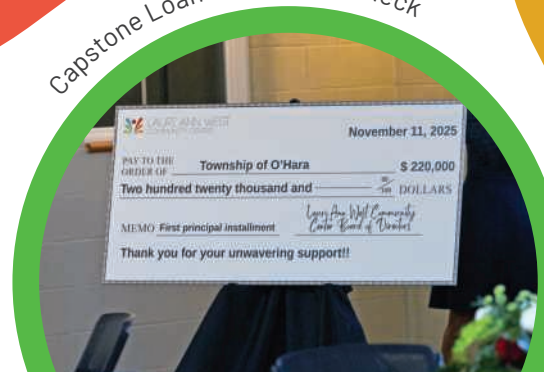


In 2025, our community center began repaying the capstone loan provided in 2013 by O'Hara Township to begin construction on the new building. The first of five annual principal payments (\$220,000) was made in November. The funds for the remaining payments are already secured in an investment account to be made seamlessly over the next four years.

10 YEAR ANNIVERSARY

WHAT BEGAN AS AN AMBITIOUS DREAM BECAME A REALITY IN APRIL 2016.

The old Boyd Community Center, once the heart of this property, was crumbling and crying out for change. Standing at a turning point, our Board of Directors dared to dream bigger - reimagining our community space as something extraordinary. Introducing a fitness center was a leap of faith, facing hefty equipment costs and unknown membership numbers. But thanks to the passion and generosity of our Legacy and Founding Family members, the fitness program sprang to life in November 2015, with the full building opening in April the following year. No one expected the new Lauri Ann West Community Center to thrive so quickly, but with the unwavering spirit of our friends and neighbors, we achieved financial stability within the first year.



CURRENT MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS OVER 4,000 INDIVIDUALS.

In the last decade, our A&E program doubled in size, and earned state certification in 2019, prompting ongoing evaluations and changes to class sizes, ratios, and instructor requirements. Our spin classes started with 12 bikes and TRX class had 6 slots on the fitness center floor. During the pandemic, we moved spin and group classes to larger rooms for distancing. As restrictions eased, class capacity grew. Now, spin classes offer 27 bikes, TRX has 37 anchors, and some classes accommodate up to 50 participants. Summer camps were not offered in 2016. In 2025, our center hosted up to 65 campers a week for 10 weekly themed camps.



The Alexander Family Community Room is our most versatile and used space, hosting diverse events daily, from fitness classes to meetings and lectures, and limited public rentals.

We continually adapt our programs and activities to meet community needs, helping everyone connect, learn, play, and grow.
